## **Future for Christ Church Community Project Update**



## **Progress Update**

28 June 2021

As reported to this month's PCC, considerable progress has been made in recent months, including:

- Amending the proposals to address Historic England's concerns about the layout, design, and the importance they place on the restoration of the nave walls\*\*. As a result, the project now proposes a kitchen, toilets, open spaces, an office, and storage.
- A Conservation Report was commissioned to fully define the works needed to restore the nave wall paintings, reveal a sample strip of earlier painting schemes, and clean/brighten the lower walls. \*
- A fully costed proposal to restore the clock faces and replace the clock mechanism\* has been obtained from Smith of Derby.
- We approached 5 lighting consultants/contractors. Two responded, have visited CC to discuss needs/options and we await their costed proposals for lighting design. \*
- Work with the Heritage Fund has progressed, and we are now encouraged to submit a funding application for a

- heritage focussed community outreach project that would also restore the nave walls, clock, and new lighting.
- An eye-catching and colourful brochure is in production that explains the project, its costs and how you can help.

We now therefore have a two-strand project:

- Future for Christ Church The provision of essential amenities and open spaces to serve the needs of the congregation and community
- 2. **Discover Christ Church!** A complementary intergenerational project co-designed with young people to find, explore, reveal, restore, and share the hidden heritage on our doorstep.
