## From Christmas to Candlemas

The Christmas tree is down, and you no longer hear [Mariah Carey's 'All I Want for Christmas is You'](#) every time you visit the supermarket, so you may have thought the festivities were over. Or are you one of those people who keep their Christmas decorations up until Candlemas?

The story of Christ begins on Christmas Day, but as we know, there are many more Christian celebrations in the calendar.

On Tuesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> February many churches will celebrate Candlemas, which may date back to pagan times - much like many other traditions now adopted into the Christian faith. There are many theories about Candlemas, but one of them relates to the story in Luke's gospel of how Jesus was brought to the Temple by his mother 40 days after he was born. Here, they were met by the elderly Anna and Simeon. Simeon lifted Jesus up and called him 'The Light to The World'. Later, as an adult, Jesus was to describe himself as 'The Light of the World' bringing love and peace and hope to a struggling world.

Many Christian churches will still bring candles to their local parish church on the day of Candlemas for blessing, and these candles will be used for the rest of the year. In pre-electricity times people would bring their own candles to church to be blessed and then used to bring light into their homes and to chase away the darkness, perhaps by lighting a candle for a child afraid of a thunderstorm at night.

Candles bring a sense of warmth and dispel darkness; the tiniest flame can illuminate and help us feel safe. They are a symbol of light and hope. In times gone by it was the custom to place a lighted candle in every window on Candlemas Day to bring light to the long dark winter – a tradition I think we would do well to revive today. During these dark days of winter, and during this time of lockdown, we need symbols of light and hope. Why not join me in lighting a candle on Candlemas Day, 2<sup>nd</sup> February. If you can, do place it in a window so others can see it, and share in hope for the future.

Also, when you are out on your daily walk, do notice another source of brightness clustered around our churches which was also closely associated with Candlemas: snowdrops, often called Candlemas Bells.

Candlemas is also the day on which we are told we can predict the end of winter. Candlemas may bring both cloud and rain, along with some very chilly temperatures. However, we may experience some refreshingly springlike days indicating that the worst is now behind us and spring is on its way!

Listening, to the radio I was horrified to hear that the daily death toll from Corona was once more exceeding a thousand. It was a strange and terrible déjà vu of listening to the radio last Spring, an experience which prompted this poem and this post, indeed this prayer. I am reposting it today in case anyone might find comfort in these words, or a voice for their own prayers:

'These are mind numbing numbers and only the exercise of compassionate imagination can give us even a glimpse of the harrowing personal stories behind each one. When I began to hear our statistics mount on our own evening radio news, I found myself again and again in prayer, knowing that even though I only heard the numbers, God knew and loved and died for the people behind those numbers.

All this found its way into the concluding section of my [Quarantine Quatrains](#) which I am posting here as a poem on its own'

## Future for Christ Church Community Project update

Many people and passers-by have told us how much they have valued and enjoyed our Christmas lights, trees and crib scene in the south porch. So much so that we are looking to continue this engagement with the wider community by having evolving displays throughout the coming year.

We continue to make progress towards gaining the necessary permissions and grant aid to make our community project a reality.

Following input from Historic England and our architect, we think that in order to maximise the potential for grant funding we should propose a phased project to:

- Deliver the urgently needed flexible open space, toilets and kitchen, plus bring forward the plans for a Parish office and storage
- Restore the nave walls and wall paintings
- Restart and re-gild the landmark spire clock

We are very pleased to report that our fundraising for the project has now passed the £3000 mark 😊 Most recently this includes a £900 grant from the Church Buildings Council towards the cost of the Conservation Report to define how the wall paintings will be restored, £350+ from Dorna's marmalades and preserves, and £681 in recent generous donations. A long way to go, but given the constraints of Covid, this is a fabulous total! We are most grateful to all our supporters.

### **Covid Vaccinations.- offer of lifts**

### **Covid Scams**

Please be alert to various scams which are circulating by text and email regarding invitations for Covid vaccinations. There have been reports that members of the public are being sent text messages, claiming to be from the NHS, asking them to sign up for coronavirus vaccination. The texts ask the recipient to click on a link which takes them to an online form where they are prompted to enter bank details. In some cases, the online form looks very similar to the real NHS website – but it is a scam.

The vaccine is only available on the NHS, is free of charge and you will not be asked for payment. The NHS will never ask for bank account details. They will not ask to see your passport or utility bills and will not arrive unannounced at your home to administer the vaccine. You will be contacted by the NHS, your employer, a local GP surgery or pharmacy to receive your vaccination. If you receive a call you believe to be fraudulent, hang up. If you are suspicious about an email you have received, forward it to [report@phishing.gov.uk](mailto:report@phishing.gov.uk). Suspicious text messages should be forwarded to the number 7726, which is free of charge.
