Dear friends

Last week I was privileged to spend some days with 30 others at Lee Abbey in Devon, on a silent retreat. The theme was prayer and looking forward, but looking back, prayer came easily for me as memories flooded back of our time together on a Benefice retreat, one warm and sunny weekend in May before the pandemic. There were people from all our four churches and time together gave us chance to get to know one another so much better. We talked, walked, indulged in cream teas, and





worshipped together.

For those us you unfamiliar with the area, Lee Abbey is a retreat house set in beautiful rolling hills with its own farm estate, a couple of miles from Lynton. From the house one can walk down to the shingly beach, walk along the cliff paths, and walk to Lynton via the Valley of the Rocks. The Valley of the Rocks is my favourite place, and the goats that roam around seem to be very tame. Lee Abbey is one of those 'thin' places where heaven and earth are deemed to meet. There is no light pollution, so on a clear night, one has the sense of almost being able to touch the myriad of stars.

The three days had a rhythm of worship and teaching input, refreshments, and meal breaks, plenty of free time to spend as we wished – walking, reading in the library, surfing in the waves (only for the hardy in January!), and there were stations set up throughout the house and chapel for prayer and meditation. One day there was the opportunity to sit in front of the log fire in the lounge and listen to specially chosen classical music on the theme of winter to spring; the following day we listened to pieces of prose and poems on a similar theme.



From my bedroom I was able to watch the sheep at feeding time; to observe them as they became alert at the sound of the quadbike approaching laden

with food; to watch the sheep dogs skilfully lead them from their field to the feeding area and back again. We were invited by our course leader to 'stop and stare' at the natural world around us, to use all our senses as we explored the area. I was reminded of WH Davies poem 'Leisure' which invites us all to do the same.

What is this life if, full of care, We have no time to stand and stare?-

No time to stand beneath the boughs And stare as long as sheep or cows:

No time to see, when woods we pass, Where squirrels hide their nuts in grass:

No time to see, in broad daylight, Streams full of stars, like skies at night:

No time to turn at Beauty's glance, And watch her feet, how they can dance:

No time to wait till her mouth can Enrich that smile her eyes began?

A poor life this if, full of care, We have no time to stand and stare.










Almost £300 raised!
