An Undiscovered Wildflower Meadow At Our Feet

I am Dave Green Ecologist/ Botanist, and for over forty years I have been involved in recording and protecting rare and valuable plant habitats, mainly in Wiltshire. In 2020, with the agreement of Revd Ann Keating, I contacted the churchwardens of South Wraxall and Monkton Farleigh churches with a view to discuss the options for creating conservation areas/wildlife Meadows in each churchyard.

This work continues an initiative that I was first involved with over 30 years ago, when it was called God's Acre; it has perpetuated in some form ever since. Many parishes have taken on board such initiatives over the years, following the principle of wildlife conservation in some way. Often this means setting aside sections of church grounds to allow wildflowers to flourish. Many close-mown churchyards hold a wealth of wild flowers, often species that are rare in the area. This is because when these pieces of ground were originally included in the church's curtilage, they would have been part of the meadow landscape of the day.

Many churchyards are full of such wildflowers that have survived for a very long time (often thanks to lack of harmful herbicides used on agricultural land) but which never get the chance to flower and so reproduce. These species have perpetuated themselves often by vegetive means over time.

My role as a botanist is to identify areas of high plant diversity and potential, so that such sections can be marked out, and left without cutting during the spring and early summer, to allow these plants to flower and set seed. The cutting regime is then resumed until the back end of the year.

I visit each site up to 3 times and identify and record what wildflowers appear. The resulting records are included in the National Plant database, and I always send the parish a full list of what has been found. I am always happy to meet interested people in late spring to show them what I have found and give a brief talk on the significance

of the grassland that forms part of their churchyard.

So, when you visit your churchyard this spring, you will notice one or more areas fenced off with posts and string. These are the wildflower plots. Do keep an eye on them as the season progresses, all manner of flowers WILL appear.
