Dear friends

It is a month since I updated you on progress following the Reflections on the future that many of you responded to over the summer.

- 1. Our new service rotas include an informal/family/accessible service to those who are unfamiliar with formal worship styles
- 2. Forest Church is proving very popular with the young and older people. At the last Forest Church on Sunday there were 24 attending including 9 children. Being outside in God's creation just enhances our worship
- 3. We have a group of musicians and singers who are keen to consider how to bring more meditative/Taizé style worship to our range of services
- 4. Three training sessions have led to new volunteers as Sacristans, Bible Readers and as those willing to lead us in Prayer and join our Welcoming Teams
- 5. Provision to our Care Homes includes a monthly Holy Communion Service and Songs of Praise service at Avon Park
- 6. Members of our churches have volunteered to enable a regular time in church for us to pray for our activities, our schools, and our communities
- 7. We have started exploring how we can make our churchyards more environmentally friendly
- 8. We have set up four new House Groups for discipleship, fellowship, bible study and pastoral care
- 9. We have started exploring how we can make the interior of some of our churches more welcoming
- 10. A monthly mid-week short service of Holy Communion has started followed by coffee

There is still time to get involved with any of the above. Just let me, or Caroline in the Office, know if you can help in any way.

Finally, you will see in the press that there is much discussion on the future of the National Church Parish system. Financially, it is a challenge to maintain it when many churches and diocese are struggling, yet, as the established Church of England divided into parishes, we have the privilege of serving not just those who attend our churches and our church schools, but every person who lives in our parishes.

Within the next two weeks I am welcoming mourners to two Funerals and to a Burial of Ashes, as well as celebrating the Baptisms of two babies in our churches - all from, or with ties to our various parishes. I have also spoken to or met with three couples with links to our parishes, who wish to get married in our churches.

Many thanks to all from our churches who will be supporting me as vergers, or musicians in the services mentioned. Please hold those families and their friends attending our churches in your prayers.


