# The way forward...

Thank you to all those who responded to our request for feedback as we move from strange pandemic times to more near-normal times. Some of the key themes raised were the loss of fellowship during the past 17 months, the desire to belong, and the wish to see a wider variety of informal worship that is accessible for all who come. In response, we have tried to create an environment that enriches our worship and our community life. Some of the initiatives below are new, whilst others are affirming and encouraging what is already happening, good and life-giving.

Whilst recognising that worshipping together on a Sunday is a key element of our church life, we need to bear in mind that we only have one full time member of clergy. The rest of our ministers are volunteers who do all they can to support our ministry and mission alongside their daily lives, and other work and volunteering commitments. We remain extremely grateful to them, and the service rotas therefore reflect their availability.

# In response to the various comments received, we therefore aim to:

- encourage attendance in our Church Services by ensuring that each week, there is at least one service across the Benefice that is planned in anticipation of families with children
- offer a minimum of one service of Holy Communion in each church a month
- offer creativity within our service provision alongside our traditional services, for example, Informal Worship, Creative Communion, Songs of Praise, café-style, visiting speakers, Forest Church etc.
- have a theme between September and Advent for our Sunday services as we regroup, rather than use the Lectionary. Our thinking is for us to consider various characters from the Bible and whom we might see as their counterparts today, and for our monthly Benefice Service to focus on topics such as Climate Change, Modern Slavery, Hospice Ministry or Harvest.
- encourage greater fellowship by creating a culture of belonging to a house group, some of which will be short-term for example an Advent or Lent group, as a key way of developing friendship, prayer support and growing in faith
- offer more flexibility of worship by online provision of a monthly service on YouTube and a once weekly Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer on Zoom
- support those who wish to worship in our care homes, especially those who cannot access online provision, by regular on-site service provision.
- encourage everyone to use their God-given gifts in the service of their church by encouraging new volunteers
- offer more opportunities for different styles of worship e.g. contemplation/meditation/Taizé
- support one another's activities across the Benefice, such as coffee mornings
- encourage greater use of our church buildings. Could a house group meet in a church? Maybe the Christ Church Wednesday morning group could meet for coffee on other Wednesdays in the month?
- encourage more informal social gatherings, a walk perhaps ending with coffee or lunch. Support children in school e.g. listening to them read
- offer occasional quiet days locally

## We would also like to encourage interested people to:

- create a Taizé music group
- offer regular organ/music groups recitals
- offer to arrange a simple lunch of bread and cheese after church
- set up different interest groups in our churches, such as perhaps environmental concern, home and overseas mission
- help our churches work towards an eco-church award

Service rotas have been distributed to our churches for the months of September, October and November as we are now planning service rotas three months in advance. We hope this will help those who are arranging rotas in support of individual church services.

The ministry team will review provision and progress in January. May God continue to bless you richly as we seek to worship God, grow in faith, and serve our communities.
